Archer's Achievements

The weekend's shoot brought several highlights for the youth archers. Olivia Dean (New Jersey) not only placed first in the compound Cadet division but also set a new World Record for a single day 720 round as well as the two day 1440 Round (701 pts. single and 1395 pts. Double) for a Star-FITA registered event through USA Archery.

Anthony-Coppola Miller (Pennsylvania), compound Cadet division earned a USA Archery JOAD Olympian achievement pin. Lastly, Madison Kaspshak (New York), compound Cub division shot a new personal best.

Traveling Trophies

Traveling trophies are part of the history of the Easterns and some have been around for over 100 years. One of the older trophies is shown above and is awarded to the standing survivor of the barebow favorite-the Hill/Fontaine shoot. (this year's winner was Jonathan Knittel). This trophy is filled with etched names and even etched signatures of past recipients. Below is a photo of a typical Hill/Fontaine set-up and all are welcome to participate. Archers shoot to knock off the ball, winners keep moving further back until one archer is left. Even if you don't have a barebow someone will generally share their bow with you so that you can experience the challenge.
